#### **Theatre Semester Courses**

#### Introduction to Theatre

Grade Level: 9 Semester Course Enrolled in JSA

Students identified as accelerated in theatre will be offered an advanced option within the course to challenge and build their skills and interests. # **Audition Technique and Portfolio**

Grade Level: 9 -12 Semester Course Enrolled in JSA

This performance course will develop and craft your audition skills for theatre, television, and film. Students will be taught how to select and perform monologues, develop cold reading techniques and experience exercises in auditions, callbacks and screen tests. Students will build an audition portfolio, create self-tape videos and a resume.

# Theatre Tech 1 - Set Design, Lighting, Sound, Scenic Projection and Stage Management

Grade Level: 9 -12 Semester Course No Prerequisite Enrolled in JSA

In this course, students will study stage technology and production, gaining a broad understanding of the roles involved in bringing a theatrical production to life. From set design and scenic painting to lighting, sound, and stage management, students will learn the technical aspects of a show. Students will also learn about dramaturgy, directing, and the roles of producers and stage managers.

#### Theatre Tech 2 - Hair, Makeup, and Costumes, Puppetry and Props

### **Improvisation**

### **Playwriting & Directing**

Uncover the essentials of playwriting, including structure, character development, dialogue, and thematic depth, while also learning the fundamentals of directing. #### **Media in Theatre Arts**
