Dear Parents, Guardians, and Caregivers,

The Jackson Local School District administrative team has evaluated new guidance from the Ohio Department of Health after a conference call with ODH Director Dr. Bruce Vanderhoff. This new guidance allows for optional pathways for students to continue in-person learning **REGARDLESS** of vaccination and mask status. Beginning Wednesday, October 27 masks are optional for students and staff in our buildings. A CDC order requiring masks on school-provided transportation remains in effect.

The most effective way to continue in-person instruction is to wear a mask and receive a COVID-19 vaccine for those students who are eligible (12 years and older). We encourage you to read the attached document in its entirety to have a greater understanding of these new "Mask to Stay / Test to Play" guidelines. It is important to remember these guidelines are exclusively for classroom and school-related activities. They <u>do not</u> apply to social gatherings outside of school or positive cases in a family setting.

These guidelines are being adopted after a pilot program among school districts in Warren County. That program showed a very low in-school transmission rate. Additionally, Dr. Bruce Vanderhoff said experiences shared by local health departments point toward a low number of direct contacts that convert to cases within school settings.

Any students or staff members identified as a close contact of an in-school positive case and who choose not to follow these guidelines must quarantine for 14 days.
