

The Jackson School for the Arts, established in 2001, is designed for students who have interests in a rigorous academic curriculum as well as a passion for visual/performing arts. Students are offered a variety of course offerings in dance, theatre, instrumental music, visual art, and vocal music. Within the JSA curriculum, students enroll in Advanced Placement, College Credit Plus, and Jackson High School's rigorous course offerings in addition to exploring courses in the arts. Over a four year period, students are exposed to all art disciplines, eventually narrowing their focus in the arts to an area of concentration. Furthermore, JSA seniors complete a 20Time capstone project in an area of their choice. JSA provides special opportunities and experiences that traditional high school programs cannot offer at no or minimal cost to students. Artists-in-residence, seminars, interdisciplinary problem-based learning, university master classes and partnerships, field trips, guest speakers, travel, arts camps, and performances are built into the rigorous curriculum. JSA provides students with community connections, leadership opportunities, and educationally based international travel opportunities.

REAL WORLD ART EXPERIENCES & TRAVEL

JSA students have the opportunity to experience world culture. This year, they have traveled to attend performances of Romeo & Juliet, Hamilton, and Hadestown at Playhouse Square. Students have participated in master classes in all arts disciplines, including Broadway workshops led by active performers. Trips have included visits to museums in Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Akron, Columbus, and Canton, studying at Kent State University, and touring the Abercrombie & Fitch design headquarters in Columbus.

PARTNERSHIPS & SERVICE LEARNING

JSA is enhanced by partnerships and collaboration with artists in residence and art organizations, as well as the Universities of Akron and Mount Union. These partnerships allow students to explore relationships between academics, the arts, and the community. JSA students complete 80 service hours, serving organizations including Akron Children's Hospital, Adopt A Family, St. Baldrick's, Trick-or-Treat so Kids Can Eat, and the Humane Society, as well as working with Jackson Township's Historical Society to create an interactive field trip experience at the one-room schoolhouse for third-grade students.

STUDENT MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS

Student arts organizations at Jackson High School include the Tri-M Music Honor Society, National Art Honor Society, Dance Honor Society, and International Thespian Society. Students also are members of National Honor Society, Spanish, French, and Chinese Honor Society, and many more. JSA extracurriculars include drama club, fall musical and spring play, art club, Steel, Jazz, Pep, and Marching Bands, Men's and Women's Chorus, Edge Dance Company, and Jacks-and-Jills.

THE MERAKI GALLERY

The Meraki Gallery is a student-run art gallery developed by JSA at Jackson High School. Students from Jackson School for the Arts are responsible for all administrative and artistic roles including directors, curators, installers, and marketers.

JSA LEADERSHIP TEAM

The Leadership Team is a group of dedicated students who work closely with the JSA teaching team to be role models to their peers, plan JSA events, and provide an online presence to the community. The Leaders advocate for students involved in all aspects of the arts by giving them a voice.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT JSA

Can you take Advanced Placement (AP) and College Credit Plus (CCP) courses while taking JSA courses?

Yes, and in addition, you may be involved in Career Tech programs. JSA encourages our high-achieving students to take AP and CCP classes that will challenge them.

What arts courses are required as Freshmen?

Freshmen are required to take Band and/or Choir and then select two of the three other arts areas (Dance, Theatre or Visual Art).

Is there a fee for JSA?

There is no fee! JSA is funded by JLS and our generous patrons, as well as through annual fundraisers: JSA Winner, Winner Chicken Dinner, the All-District Arts Extravaganza, and summer camps.

Can I do JSA and sports?

YES! JSA students participate in Jackson and club sports.

Does JSA provide travel opportunities?

Our JSA juniors and seniors take a trip to Europe every other year. This year we are traveling to Venice, Florence, and Rome. Our last trip was to Saltsburg, Vienna, Budapest, and Prague. Next year band will travel to Hawaii and choir will travel to NYC.

Should I do JSA if I don't plan on pursuing the arts after high school? JSA students possess the skills necessary to succeed in any professional field. JSA students have unique, creative, problem-solving skills that make them marketable in a competitive environment. JSA teaches creative thinking, time management, leadership, and the importance of teamwork.


