Superintendent Chris DiLoreto delivered the following commencement address to the Jackson High School Class of 2023 and their loved ones in attendance.



Good evening parents, Jackson Local Board of Education members, faculty, support staff, and honored guests, our graduates. To the Class of 2023, it is my great honor to be among the first to formally congratulate you this evening on the completion of your high school career.

Graduation is a milestone, it is a time to celebrate, and a time to reflect on the accomplishments of your past and the promise of your future. Today, Class of 2023, we celebrate you!

For the past 13 years, your experiences – in our classrooms, the arts or global academies, our career tech rooms, our athletic fields and venues, the band and choir rooms, lunch rooms, and school buses have served as practice round for the game of life. We have learned so much from those experiences. We have learned how to experience success.

Most recently, the Class of 2023 helped improve our U.S. News & World ranking as one of the best in Ohio and among the top 5.5 percent in the country. Our seniors have been a part of four of the 12 straight Federal League all-sports trophies. Our bands and choirs earned multiple state awards of excellence, and over the past 13 years, we have learned humility and perseverance from our defeats.

Families, we appreciate your support, trust, and partnership throughout the years. Together, I believe, we are sending students who are ready to discover their passion and purpose, and do so with the very things they have been learning and honing since kindergarten.

Graduates, it does not matter where you go from here. You leave here today Polar Bears forever. You have left your legacy. Today is closing just one chapter of your life. You control your own destiny. Believe in yourself. Follow your passion and purpose.

Class of 2023 today is your day, tomorrow is your future. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve you, and our educational community as your superintendent. Thank you, good luck, and Go Bears!

CHRISTOPHER GOFF began his first term in January 2008 and has been re-elected three times. He holds a bachelor of science degree in business administration, with a major in finance from Ohio Northern University, a master’s degree in political science from The University of Akron, and a juris doctor from The University of Akron School of Law. He is CEO and General Counsel at Employers Health and is an Adjunct Professor of Law at The University of Akron School of Law. Mr. Goff and his wife have three adult children who have graduated from Jackson Local Schools.

TONYA WRIGHT was appointed to the Board of Education in June 2020 and was elected to the Board in November 2021. She has a track record dedicated to servant leadership in Jackson and Stark County. 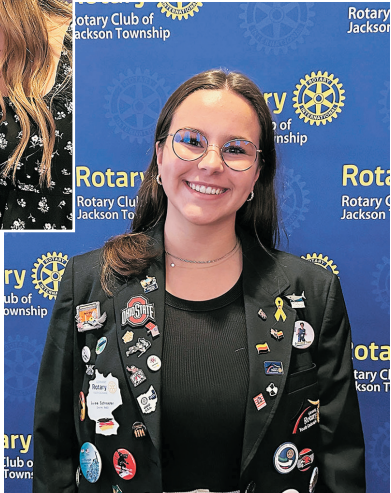
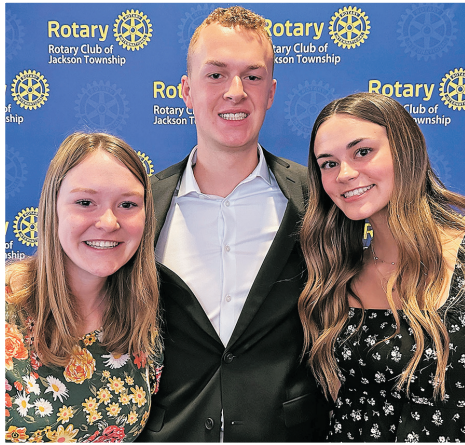
Jackson Local seeks to serve students with disabilities

Within the intent of the federal statutes (Rehabilitation Act of 1973-section 504 and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act IDEA-public law 105-17), the Jackson Local School District continues its effort to locate and identify children with disabilities from birth through age 21. Children with disabilities have physical, emotional, and/or mental impairments that may require special education. Public schools provide free and appropriate education regardless of a child’s disability. However, before these children can be served, they must be found. Many of these children are not

visible because they may not function in the community’s mainstream, and many are preschoolers. Parents may not realize that programs and services are available through their school district or from agencies in their community.

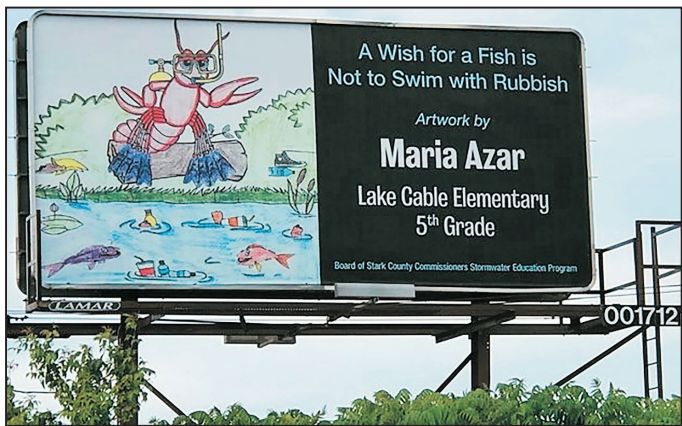

Music Stand Refurbishing Project Leads to Eagle Scout Rank

KARA SMITH'S EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT INVOLVED SANDING, CLEANING, REPAIRING, AND REPAINTING HUNDREDS OF MUSIC STANDS FOR THE JACKSON LOCAL SCHOOLS BAND PROGRAM. The Jackson band program spreads over eight grades at both the middle school and high school and requires heavy use of expensive music stands by almost a thousand students. As Kara began coming into her senior year of the band program, she noticed that a lot of these stands needed repairs and to be repainted. After speaking with Mrs. Monigold, the head director of the band program, she decided to dedicate her project to fixing up these stands so that they could be used again for years to come by music students. The project took place over a week in June 2022, accounting for moving the stands to the bus garage, then preparing and painting them. In the end, over 200 man-hours were put into this project and had help from fellow scouts, scouting adults, and band members. Kara is incredibly proud of how the project went, and thanks everyone for allowing her to complete a project that will have a lasting impact on a program she loves.

In February 2019, Kara joined scouting as a founding member of Troop 111, the first and largest all-girls Boy Scout troop in Buckeye Council. Throughout her journey of scouting, she held multiple leadership positions, learned survival skills, and attended long-term summer camps. In the summer of 2020 she was also elected into the Order of the Arrow, scouting's honors society. She ascended the ranks of scouting, earning her Eagle rank in the fall of 2022 after completing her project for the Jackson Local Schools band program. She had 33 merit badges by the time she earned her Eagle, accounting for 3 Eagle palms. As an adult in scouting, Kara still stays involved by serving as a Junior Assistant Scoutmaster in her troop, as well as staying active as a youth committee member in the Order of the Arrow and teaching aquatic merit badges through Venturing Crew 820.
