Freshmen

College Planning Guidelines

Freshmen

- ⇒ Plan appropriate high school courses.
- ⇒ Review requirements for high school graduation, Honor's Diploma and President's Award of Educational Excellence.
- ⇒ Become involved in extracurricular activities.
- ⇒ Become familiar with college entrance requirements.
- ⇒ Arrange to meet with your counselor at least once a year.
- ⇒ Explore careers and majors on the Internet by visiting OCIS, ACT and College Board websites.
- ⇒ Explore summer opportunities at colleges and universities.
- ⇒ Consider volunteering in the community. (Create a log and record hours)

Sophomore

- ⇒ Continue to take appropriate high school courses and participate in extracurricular activities.
- ⇒ Explore various programs offered at JHS. Example: Dual Credit/CCP, International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement.
- ⇒ Attend College and Career Day to learn about Career & Technical Program options that begin junior year.
- ⇒ Start collecting college information and continue to explore careers and majors on the internet.
- ⇒ Explore summer opportunities at colleges and universities.
- ⇒ If interested, attend CCP meeting in February. Students need an ACT score by March for this application process.
- ⇒ Continue or begin volunteer activities within the community.
- ⇒ Build a relationship with your high school counselor so they can get to know you.
