  - Stark County Educational Service Center: Mental Health Services: As needed and student specific services aimed to provide a holistic and integrated approach to treatment and recovery, helping individuals achieve lasting wellness and stability.

- 2. Family Support Specialist: \$49,691.56 (10.3%)
  - o Contracted through the ESC to provide family support services. Family Support Specialists enhance student mental health and academic success by providing holistic and consistent support to families, creating a stable and nurturing environment that promotes overall student well-being.
- 3. Prevention Education: \$87,884 (18.3%)
  - o Smart Social App: \$15,000
    - Promotes mental well-being by curating positive content, providing mental health resources, monitoring screen time, and fostering a supportive community. Emphasizes privacy and safety to reduce cyberbullying and mitigate anxiety, depression, and low self-esteem.
  - o PAX Good Behavior Game: \$72,884
    - An elementary classroom intervention promoting positive behavior and preventing mental health issues. Involves team-based activities, rewards for good behavior, and developing self-regulation skills. Teachers receive training and ongoing support, fostering a positive classroom environment to reduce long-term mental health issues.

### DPIA FY24/25 Spending Plan:

- 1. Safety: \$37,190.28 (100% of DPIA funding)
  - o A portion of the salary for our Director of Security is allocated using DPIA funding to help ensure a safe learning environment.

Summary: This plan addresses immediate mental health needs and provides ongoing family

support, fostering a collaborative and safe environment that enhances student success both academically and emotionally. The combined efforts of school guidance counselors and the

Family Support Specialist create a robust support system that promotes overall mental well-

being and resilience in students. By utilizing tools such as the Smart Social App and the PAX Good Behavior Game to encourage positive mental habits, behavior, and self-regulation, the plan helps prevent long-term mental health issues.

#### 7510 - USE OF DISTRICT PREMISES

The Board of Education believes that school premises should be made available for community purposes, provided that such use does not infringe on the original and necessary purpose of the property or interfere with the educational program of the schools and is harmonious with the purposes of this District.

For purposes of this policy, the terms "school premises" or "premises" refers to all indoor and outdoor structures, facilities, and land owned, rented, or leased by the Board. The term "non-school hours" refers to times prior to and after regular classroom instruction on a day that school is in session, and any day that school is not in session, including weekends, holidays, and vacation breaks.

The Board will permit the use of school premises when such permission has been requested in writing by a responsible organization or a group of at least seven (7) citizens and has been approved by the Superintendent.

School premises shall be available for the below-listed uses. When there are competing interests, approval will be given according to the following priorities (Each of the below listed uses is requested, but may be renumbered in order of priority A through H):

- A. uses directly related to the schools and the operations of the schools (including giving instructions in any branch of education, learning, or the arts)
- B. uses and groups indirectly related to the schools
- C. meetings of employee associations
- D. departments or agencies of the municipal government
- E. other governmental agencies
- F. community organizations or groups of individuals primarily comprised of District residents/members of the community, including students (during non-school hours) and employees (when not working in the scope of their employment) formed or gathered for charitable, civic, social, religious, recreational (e.g., indoor or outdoor games or physical activities, either organized or unorganized, that are undertaken for exercise, relaxation, diversion, sport, or pleasure), and/or educational purposes, provided such meetings and/or entertainment is nonexclusive and open to the general public.

School premises shall also be made available to any certified candidate for public office and any recognized political party or organization for the purpose of conducting public discussions of public questions and issues. School premises shall be free of charge and available only during non-school hours. Users shall abide by all District policies, guidelines, and rules regarding the use of school premises and be liable for any damage incurred. Under no circumstances shall school premises be used to raise funds for political purposes.

The use of school premises shall not be granted for any purpose that is prohibited by law.

Should all or any part of the District's community be struck by a disaster, the Board shall make school premises available, at no charge, for the housing, feeding, and care of victims or potential victims when requested by local, State, or Federal authorities. The Superintendent should meet with the Jackson Township to establish a disaster preparedness plan in order to ensure that proper procedures are established to minimize confusion, inefficiency, and disruption of the educational program.

The Superintendent shall develop administrative guidelines for the granting of permission to use school premises including a schedule of fees which, together with the costs used to determine such fees, must be approved by the Board. Such guidelines are to include the following:

- A. Each user may be required to present evidence of the purchase of organizational liability insurance to the limit prescribed by District administrative guidelines, a waiver of subrogatoion and additional insured in favor of Jackson Local School District must be listed as additional insured, If necessary, a certificate of liability needs to include general liability and umbrella coverage on the certificate. A minimum of 2 million dollars aggregate on the general liability and 1 million dollars each occurrence general liability limits
- B. Use of school equipment in conjunction with the use of school premises must be requested specifically in writing and may be granted by the procedure by which permission to use school premises is granted. The users of school equipment must accept liability for any damage or loss to such equipment that occurs while it is in their use. Where rules so specify, no item of equipment may be used except by a qualified operator.
- C. Users shall be liable financially for damage to the facilities and for proper chaperonage.

No liability shall attach to this District, or any of its employees and officers, specifically as a consequence of permitting access to school premises.

The Superintendent recommends approval and execution of the joint development agreement ("Agreement") for construction of the ODOT Safe Routes Project ("Project") between the Jackson Local School District Board of Education (the "Board") and Jackson Township (the "Township").

### Background:

- 1. The Board and the Township wish to construct a new sidewalk along the eastern side of STA SR 241 which will include new pedestrian signals, curb ramps, and crosswalks.
- 2. In accordance with Ohio Revised Code 715.02, the Board and the Township desire to enter into an Agreement for the construction and management of the Project.
- 3. Under the terms of the Agreement, the Township is responsible for procuring and paying for all design and construction costs for the Project. The Board will assist procurement and reimburse the Township for such costs for the Project.
- 4. The Superintendent and Treasurer request authority to negotiate, finalize, and execute the Agreement and any other required related documentation consistent with the intent of this Resolution.

The Board of Education hereby resolves as follows:

The Superintendent and Treasurer, with the assistance of legal counsel, are authorized to negotiate, finalize, and execute the Agreement and any other required related documentation consistent with the intent of this Resolution.

The Superintendent requests authority to enter into an agreement with Whisler Plumbing & Heating Inc. (the "Contractor") for the Water Heater Upgrades Project (the "Project"). Rationale:

- 1. The District previously identified a need for the Project.
- 2. The District is a member of the INCompliance Consulting National Purchasing Consortium ("ICNPC"), which is a national association of political subdivisions.
- 3. Ohio Revised Code Section 9.48 authorizes boards of education, as political subdivisions, to participate in joint purchasing programs operated by or through a national or state association of political subdivisions in which the purchasing political subdivision is eligible for membership.
- 4. Pursuant to Attorney General Opinion 2024-003, Ohio Revised Code Section 9.48 allows a board of education to procure installation, maintenance, and repair services through a joint purchasing program with the procurement being exempt from any competitive bidding requirements.

- 5. The Project is for installation, maintenance, and repair services.
- 6. The Contractor submitted a pricing proposal through ICNPC for the Project in the amount of \$189,125.
- 7. The Superintendent recommends the Board authorize the Superintendent and Treasurer to negotiate and execute an agreement with Contractor for the Project in an amount not to exceed \$189, 125 (the "Contract Sum").
- 8. The Superintendent also requests authority for the Superintendent and Treasurer to enter change orders on behalf of the Board in a total amount not to exceed 10% of the Contract Sum. Change orders in excess of that aggregate amount will be brought to the Board for its approval.

### The Board of Education resolves as follows:

- 1. The Board acknowledges that the Proposal is exempt from competitive bidding requirements pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 9.48.
- 2. The Board approves the selection of Contractor for the Project and authorizes the Superintendent and Treasurer to work with legal counsel to negotiate and execute an agreement with Contractor and to sign any related documents for the Project, in an amount not to exceed the Contract Sum.
- 3. The Board also authorizes the Superintendent and Treasurer to enter change orders on behalf of the Board in a total amount not to exceed 10% of the Contract Sum. Change orders in excess of that aggregate amount will be brought to the Board for its approval.
