Citing a website

What is the name of the editor, author, or compiler? (If I can't find one, I skip it in the citation.)

What is the name of the page? (If I am citing the entire web site, I skip this step.)

What is the name of the site?

What is the version number of the site? (Skip this step if there isn't one.)

What is the name of the institution or organization connected with the site?

What date was this created or last updated?

How are you viewing this information? (Web)

What date did you look at the information?

How to set up a web citation

How to set up a Web citation (full website)

Editor/author/compiler name (if available). *Name of Site*. Version number. Name of the institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher), date of resource creation (if available). Medium of publication. Date of access.

How to set up a Web citation (page on a website)

Editor/author/compiler name (if available). "Title of page." *Name of Site*. Version number. Name of the institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher), date of resource creation (if available). Medium of publication. Date of access.

Works Cited Resource

An Article from an Online Database (or other Electronic Subscription Service)

Who is the author? (If you don't have an author, begin the citation with the title.)

What is the title of the article?

What is the title of the newspaper, magazine, book, etc.?

What is the date of publication? Include month, day, year.

What are the pages of the article?

What is the name of the database?

How are you viewing this article? Print? Web? CD?

What date did you look at the information?

How to set up an online database citation

Author(s). "Title of Article." *Title of Magazine, etc* Day Month Year of Publication: pages.
Database Name. Medium of Publication. Day Month Year of Access.

How to set up an online database citation for a scholarly journal

Scholarly journal: Notice the volume number, issue number, and year in parenthesis.

Author(s). "Title of Article." *Title of Journal* Volume. Issue (year): pages.
Database Name. Medium of Publication. Day Month Year of Access.
