Students are expected to be on their best behavior in school and follow the rules established by the principal, teachers, and other staff members. If you have any questions about school wide rules you can refer to the student handbook on the Lake Cable webpage. This helps provide a positive learning atmosphere where all students can work to the best of his or her ability. During the first week of school, we will discuss classrcum rules. Please have a discussion with your child about the importance of following rules in school.

## Classroom Rules:

1. Treat others the way that you want to be treated.
2. Be prepared for class.
3. Follow directions and stay on task.
4.Work quietly and do not interrupt others.

## 5. Do your best!

In our classroom we will use a colored behavior chart. Each child will begin the day on the color green. Students have the ability to move up during the day for positive choices and down throughout the day for poor decisions. There are six different colors: pink, purple, blue, green, yellow, and red. At the end of the day, your child will color in the date
on their planner according to what color they earned that day. If your child receives a yellow or red mark in their planner a note will be sent home written by me, or the student (I will initial) to explain why he or she is on that particular color. Be sure to check your child's planner each day after school in order to review behavior and homework assignments ect. (Occasionally I will also leave notes in your child's planner in the communications section located under the days homework assignments.) The following is an explanation of what each color means.

- Pink - Supper Student
- Purple - Great Job
- Blue - Good Choices
- Green - Ready to Learn - I had a great day!

- Yellow - Think About It - I forgot my homework or did not follow a classroom rule (after being warned). I had to miss 5 minutes of recess. A yellow note was sent home describing What happened.
- Red - Parent Contact - I had to miss my whole recess and a red note waS sent home describing What happened.

If your child is absent due to illness or another situation, he or she is expected to make up the work that is missed. Students makeup work will be placed in their mailbox. If students miss an extended amount of time or there is a project I will create a "While You Were Out" folder for them. A sheet of paper will be included in this folder where all assignments will be listed. Please have your child complete these assignments in a reasonable about of time (typically one day per day absent). Return the assignments in the folder when EVERYTHING is complete. Thank you!

## HOMC(OBR

Homework will be assigned almost every day. Your child will have 1-3 assignments to complete. Please work with your child to establish good homework habits early in the year.

It is your child's responsibility to bring his or her homework each day. If, for some reason, your child does not have his or her homework, your child will move his or her clip to the yellow. This is to help encourage responsibility within the students! They will also have to stay in for recess to complete the assignment that is due. If this becomes a habit, we will work together to find a solution to the problem.

All homework assignments will be written in your child's planner each day. I will initiol their planners every afternoon the first nine weeks of school to assure that they are filling it in correctly. The initial shows you that what is in their planner is the correct assignment. Please be sure to check your child's planner daily, sign it, and refer to the weekly newsletter for a quick glimpse at what we will be studying each week. Along with nightly homework, I highly suggest that your child spends at least 20 minutes reading and 15 minutes practicing math facts 5 days a week. This extra practice is vital in order for each student to reach his or her highest learning potential. These ideas are: describe special or funny stories about your child, write a silly or serious poem about your child, tell us some neat things we may not know about your child, send silly or special pictures with a letter describing the pictures, or write a short story with your child as them main character.
Wednesday -- Favorite Book
Your child will bring in one of his or her favorite picture books to read to the class. The book should take no more than 10 minutes to read. Please prepare by repeatedly reading the book at home together. This can also he a poem. This book may be rhecked out from our library the week
before your child's week. You may also take a trip to the local library to select a book if you do not have one at home.
Thursday -- Lunch Buddy

## Reading Achievement Test

*Finding Supporting Details *Multiple Mear:ng Words
Students will be expected to use TQAA (Turn the Question Around and Answer) to answer questions throughout the year. TQAA helps students answer questions in complete sentences.

## STANDFORD ACHIEVEMENT \& OTTS LENNON TESTS

These tests will also be taken in October. This is a form of standardized testing to measure ability in different content areas.

## MATH ACHIEVEMENT TEST

This test will take place in the spring. It will be a test that assesses your child's understanding of third grade math standards.
